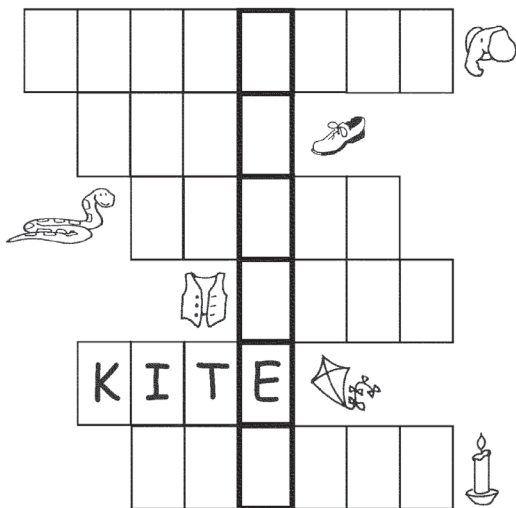

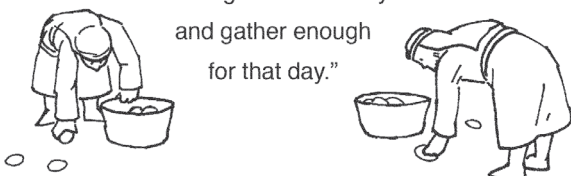

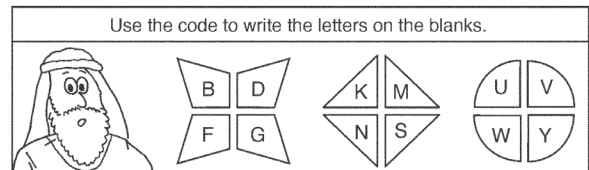

BREAD OF LIFE

Reflection on John 6:24-35

The Gospel of John contains a host of signs and symbols, of which many have multiple layers of meaning. Bread is one of those.

At its most basic meaning, bread is a symbol for physical sustenance. People need food to stay alive and to grow. So bread is a sign of the very life of God, and God's care for His people.

But we are also fed spiritually by God's revelation to us, by His Word, and so bread is also a sign of the divine wisdom that comes to us in God's Word. Jesus is the Living Word of God, and so He can proclaim that He is the Bread of Life. Finally, because Jesus gave us Himself in the Eucharist, this gift of His Body and Blood is the "bread that came down from heaven" that alone can feed our deepest hungers. Through our celebration of the Eucharist, we taste and see the goodness of the Lord, as the bread that was once only a symbol now becomes the Real Presence of the Lord.

We need to keep coming back to the Eucharist because we yearn to become one with God. The Eucharist is God's gift and invitation to eternal life, to encounter the one who feeds us and says, "Go and do likewise."

SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS

Saint of the Day: August 9

Patron Saint of: Christian Converts

A brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was 14, Edith Stein was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her baptism in 1922. Twelve years later she imitated Saint Teresa by becoming a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau, Germany – now Wroclaw, Poland – Edith abandoned Judaism in her teens. As a student at the University of Göttingen, she became fascinated by phenomenology – an approach to philosophy. Excelling as a protégé of Edmund Husserl, one of the leading phenomenologists, Edith earned a doctorate in philosophy in 1916. She continued as a university teacher until 1922, when she moved to a Dominican school in Speyer; her appointment as lecturer at the Educational Institute of Munich ended under pressure from the Nazis.

After living for four years in the Cologne Carmel, Sister Teresa Benedicta moved to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands, in 1938. The Nazis occupied that country in 1940. In retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians. Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa, also a Catholic, died in a gas chamber in Auschwitz on August 9, 1942.

Pope John Paul II beatified Teresa Benedicta of the Cross in 1987 and canonized her 12 years later.

The writings of Edith Stein fill 17 volumes, many of which have been translated into English. A woman of integrity, she followed the truth wherever it led her. Sister Josephine Koeppel, O.C.D., translator of several of Edith's books, sums up this saint with the phrase, "Learn to live at God's hands."
