## Shepherd's Column

### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week, we are privileged to celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since this is a Holy Day of Obligation, I thought it would be useful to reflect on why we have these obligatory Holy Days and how they fit into our lives.

The Church lists every Sunday and several other days throughout the year as days of obligation, which require us to attend Mass and refrain from unnecessary work. I think often, we hear the word “obligation,” and we think that it is something imposed upon us, something that we may not necessarily want to do, but feel like we have to do. I think this may be the wrong lens through which to view our participation in the sacred mysteries of the Mass. If you are anything like me, you are very busy. Whether this is actually being busy, or just feeling like there’s just so much to do all the time, this busyness has a tendency to overtake our lives. This is not in keeping with a Christian life, which should be marked primarily by freedom. Now I know that it is perhaps an unpopular opinion to say that rules and obligations make us free. However, having guiderails on our lives can allow us to act with freedom without veering off into complacency, distraction, and sin. The Church’s laws are meant to allow us to make positive free choices.

A Holy Day of Obligation is meant to be a reminder that while our obligations in this world are important, our obligations to God are much more so. They give us an opportunity to rest, spend time with family, and pray together as a community. The world can be so distracting, but having these days set aside for our faith and family life is a beautiful blessing that allows us to exercise our Christian freedom! I look forward to joining you in prayer as we celebrate the Assumption of our Blessed Lady. May God richly bless you!



## THE FULLNESS OF LIFE


Reflection on Jn 6:41-51

Elijah, who has just defeated the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel and is now being pursued by a furious Queen Jezebel's army, sits down under a broom tree and prays for death. He is finished. But God has more plans for Elijah, and sends His angel to feed him and strengthen him for the journey to Horeb, the mountain of God.

I once met an angel, who looked very much like a Dominican sister. The details aren't important, but I was very much in the darkness of doubt and despair (a place we all have been), and was ready to give up completely. Sister N., so very gently but with firmness, helped me to see that God wasn't finished with me yet, and that God had some significant work for me to tend to in His Kingdom. Angels, God's messengers, are everywhere, in many guises.

In today's Gospel, Jesus, in quoting the prophets, says, "They shall all be taught by God," and that He Himself, as the "living bread that came down from heaven," gives Himself to us "for the life of the world." This echoes another saying of Jesus, that "I have come that they might have life, and have it to the full." Fullness of life comes in the eternity that breaks into our lives now, never more so than in our participation in the Eucharistic banquet. The Eucharist, and all those God places in our paths who become eucharist for us, is the great teacher.

## SAINT STEPHEN OF HUNGARY

Saint of the Day: August 16

Patron Saint of: Bricklayers, Hungary

The Church is universal, but its expression is always affected—for good or ill—by local culture. There are no "generic" Christians; there are Mexican Christians, Polish Christians, Filipino Christians. This fact is evident in the life of Stephen, Polish hero and spiritual patron of Hungary.

Born a pagan, he was baptized around the age of 10, together with his father, chief of the Magyars, a group who migrated to the Danube area in the ninth century. At 20, he married Gisela, sister to the future emperor, Saint Henry. When he succeeded his father, Stephen adopted a policy of Christianization of the country for both political and religious reasons. He suppressed a series of revolts by pagan nobles and welded the Magyars into a strong national group. He asked the pope to provide for the Church's organization in Hungary—and also requested that the pope confer the title of king upon him. He was crowned on Christmas Day in 1001.

Stephen established a system of tithes to support churches and pastors and to relieve the poor. Out of every 10 towns, one had to build a church and support a priest. He abolished pagan customs with a certain amount of violence, and commanded all to marry, except clergy and religious. He was easily accessible to all, especially the poor.

In 1031, his son Emeric died, and the rest of Stephen's days were embittered by controversy over his successor. His nephews attempted to kill him. He died in 1038 and was canonized, along with his son, in 1083.
