Shepherd's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our Gospel this weekend will be challenging for us all to hear, and even more challenging for me and my brother priests around the world to preach about. The Lord reveals a fundamental truth about the mystery of salvation to the disciples, and many do not accept it. In fact, many not only challenge His teaching, but they walk away from Him entirely because of it. The challenging part of that Gospel pericope is this: Jesus didn't stop them.

It would be a mistake to say that Jesus did not care about these people, or their opinion. On the contrary, He cared so much that He walked with them and guided them and met them where they were at, to do His best to explain an extraordinarily challenging teaching to them. I would argue that He did everything within His power to convince them of the truth of His message. However, He refused to change the message to make them happy. When He was challenged on it, He doubled down. He reinforced the truth of what He was saying. He did not want them to leave, and I can imagine Him pleading with them to stay. However, Christ respected their freedom to choose for or against His teaching.

We should not imagine that anything is different about our Lord today. He does not make it easy to be His followers, and in fact, He often challenges us beyond our comfort level – perhaps even our current ability to understand. However, the Lord always speaks truth, and if we are open to His love and wisdom, I truly believe He will make this truth understandable to us in time.

I encourage you, brothers and sisters, to never walk away from the Lord. When you run into teachings that are challenging, pray about them, and do not dismiss them. Seek resources and understanding. Know that the Lord walks with you in your discomfort and desires you to come to full understanding. He gave us a brain so that we could know His truth, not so we could blindly follow. We live in a wonderful time where knowledge and information are so accessible. I would like to challenge you, as I challenge myself, to never stop seeking the reason behind our faith.

May God richly bless you!

ST. PEREGRINE CANCER CARE COMMITTEE TRAINING




Reflection on John 6:60-69

There is both some painful questioning (How can anyone take this seriously? Does this shake your faith? Do you want to leave me, too? But where else would we go?), and some deep affirming (As for me and my family, we will serve the Lord! You have the words of eternal life. I have come to believe you are God's Holy One!) in our Scripture readings this weekend. I would suggest that the paradox is that both are necessary for a lively faith.

I know that my life has been a journey of discovery, in the truth of Graham Green's observation that "if we really believe in something, we have no choice but to go further." Going further and deeper into the discovery of what I believe, affirm, value is a lifelong project, as the depths of God's call will have different implications for the many seasons of our lives. I have found that it is often through wrestling with the hard questions in life that I can affirm what is good and true and beautiful.

One of the dangers in this faith journey is falling into the trap of seeing God as an object of my thoughts, when the truth is that I am a reality in the mind of God. This truth frees me to be in right relationship, with God and with others, knowing that growing in God means submitting to, deferring to, being subject to one another in love.

MARTYRDOM OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Saint of the Day: August 29

Patron Saint of: First Communicants and pilgrims

The drunken oath of a king with a shallow sense of honor, a seductive dance and the hateful heart of a queen combined to bring about the martyrdom of John the Baptist. The greatest of prophets suffered the fate of so many Old Testament prophets before him: rejection and martyrdom. The "voice crying in the desert" did not hesitate to accuse the guilty, did not hesitate to speak the truth. But why? What possesses a man that he would give up his very life?

This great religious reformer was sent by God to prepare the people for the Messiah. His vocation was one of selfless giving. The only power that he claimed was the Spirit of Yahweh. "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

Scripture tells us that many people followed John looking to him for hope, perhaps in anticipation of some great messianic power. John never allowed himself the false honor of receiving these people for his own glory. He knew his calling was one of preparation. When the time came, he led his disciples to Jesus: "The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God.' The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus" (John 1:35-37).

It is John the Baptist who has pointed the way to Christ. John's life and death were a giving over of self for God and other people. His heart was centered on God and the call that he heard from the Spirit of God speaking to his heart. Confident of God's grace, he had the courage to speak words of condemnation, repentance, and salvation.


