

- Equipping Catholics to get involved and support public policies that uphold their beliefs and values through a monthly newsletter, action alerts, and advocacy events.







COMES FROM WITHIN

Reflection on Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23
If I thought much about it at all when I was a child, I probably would have said that I went to Sunday Mass because that is what we did as Catholics. There wasn't anything unusual about going to Mass as a family.

But here is my confession: In my first semester of college, I think I went to Mass only once. Perhaps that was typical for an 18-year-old on his own for the first time, beyond the reach of house rules. When home for Thanksgiving, however, house rules applied and I attended Mass with my family. I remember vividly realizing that weekend that this grounding, this gift of the Mass, was an experience that I missed terribly. The Mass centered me, and helped me remember who I was and what I was supposed to be about in the world.

We can approach our life of faith as a series of obligations, and keep a close, calculating watch on our actions and those of others, making sure we and they are in conformity with all the laws, customs and traditions of our church. This seems to be what the scribes and Pharisees are about in today's Gospel, as they have a close eye on the actions of Jesus and His disciples.

Jesus is more interested in what comes "from within people, from their hearts." He lists a lot of evils that can come from within, and I suspect we are all too familiar with them. However, there are also many virtues enacted in our lives that also come from within. This is where we are beckoned to go.

SAINT TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Saint of the Day: September 5

Patron Saint of: World Youth Day and the Missionaries of Charity

Born to Albanian parents in what is now Skopje, Macedonia, Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhiu was the youngest of the three children who survived. During her years in public school, Agnes participated in a Catholic sodality and showed a strong interest in the foreign missions. At age 18, she entered the Loreto Sisters of Dublin. It was 1928 when she said goodbye to her mother for the final time and made her way to a new land and a new life. The following year she was sent to the Loreto novitiate in Darjeeling, India. There she chose the name Teresa and prepared for a life of service.

In 1946, while riding a train to Darjeeling to make a retreat, Sister Teresa heard what she later explained as "a call within a call. The message was clear. I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them." She also heard a call to give up her life with the Sisters of Loreto and instead, to "follow Christ into the slums to serve him among the poorest of the poor."

She returned to Calcutta, where she lived in the slums and opened a school for poor children. Dressed in a white sari and sandals – the ordinary dress of an Indian woman – she soon began getting to know her neighbors – especially the poor and sick – and getting to know their needs through visits.

For the next four decades, Mother Teresa worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor. Her love knew no bounds. Nor did her energy, as she crisscrossed the globe pleading for support and inviting others to see the face of Jesus in the poorest of the poor. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. On September 5, 1997, God called her home. Blessed Teresa was canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016.


