

Shepherd's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are in the midst of an election cycle which will see the majority of our national and local elected offices come up on our ballots in just about a month. It is important as we participate in our democratic process to keep in mind what our Faith teaches us about being good citizens of our republic. Catholic teaching on voting in a democracy emphasizes our moral responsibility as individuals to participate in the political process.

Key principles of our Catholic social teaching on voting include:

- Informed Conscience: Voters should form their consciences based on Church teachings, Scripture, and moral principles. This means understanding candidates' positions and the implications of policies.
- Common Good: Decisions should prioritize the common good, promoting justice, peace, and the well-being of all, particularly the marginalized.
- Participation: Active engagement in the democratic process is a duty, reflecting the belief that citizens have a role in shaping society and upholding moral values. We must, if we are able, vote.
- Respect for Life: Issues such as abortion, euthanasia, and social justice are critical.
 Voters are encouraged to support candidates and policies that protect human dignity and promote life.
- Solidarity and Subsidiarity: Decisions should respect individual rights, while fostering community welfare, balancing local governance with the broader needs of society.

Catholic social teaching calls for thoughtful and responsible voting as a means of living out one's faith in the public sphere. Ultimately, we bear a responsibility of informing our consciences using these principles and voting for the candidate who will best exemplify these values to maintain the great blessings of liberty and freedom which we enjoy. May God be with you as you vote, and may God save the United States of America.

TIME AND ETERNITY

Reflection on Mark 10:17-30

Every human person is a child of both time and eternity. The challenge we face is to live in time while being centered in eternity - what Jesus called living in the world but not of the world.

Living in time, we have to own things, to accumulate some wealth, to plan for the future. This is the way of social responsibility. The spiritual wisdom we gain from the Gospel challenges us to balance and blend the demands of both time and eternity so as to engage in the world without delusion, without the world and its wealth dominating us. Even while we have possessions, we have to disown them, not allow them to own us. Centered in God's grace so very deeply, we see wealth as a means and an opportunity for "loving our neighbor," for extending God's blessedness to others.

Jesus teaches that everything is gift; and that what we have received as a gift, we must give as a gift. Jesus stands long-suffering in His loving look at each of us, asking of us that "one more thing."

SAINT LUKE

Saint of the Day: October 18

Patron Saint of: Artists/Painters, Brewers and Butchers

Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy
- 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation
- 3) The Gospel of the Poor
- 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation
- 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit
- 6) The Gospel of Joy

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works.


