We offer two options for requesting Mass Intentions: Self-Service Online or Manual Assistance through the Office.

SELF-SERVICE ONLINE

The self-service online system enables the faithful to view available Memorials and Mass times, reserve in real-time, and make payment by credit card online. This efficient system will ensure a much quicker response to your requests.

OFFICE ASSISTED

If you prefer not to use the self-service online system, you can contact our Parish Office at 740-967-7871 or email office@cotaj.org.

If you plan to use a credit card for your donation, we recommend utilizing the online portal.

OFFERINGS

While a donation is not required to secure a Mass Intention, the parish gratefully accepts any offered donation, though the typical amount is \$10.00 per intention. For credit or debit card offerings, we prefer that you use the online portal accessible by scanning the QR code. If you wish to donate by cash or check, please call the Parish Office at 740-967-7871 or email office@cotaj.org, and a staff member will be happy to assist you. If you are unable to make a donation at this time, please reach out to the office for help in scheduling your intention.

LIMITATIONS

To ensure fairness and equity for all faithful, we kindly ask that you prayerfully adhere to the following guidelines when requesting.

Mass Intentions: limit your requests to 12 per household annually, restrict requests to a maximum of 3 per quarter (three-month period) per household, and ensure they are not consecutive in terms of day or time.

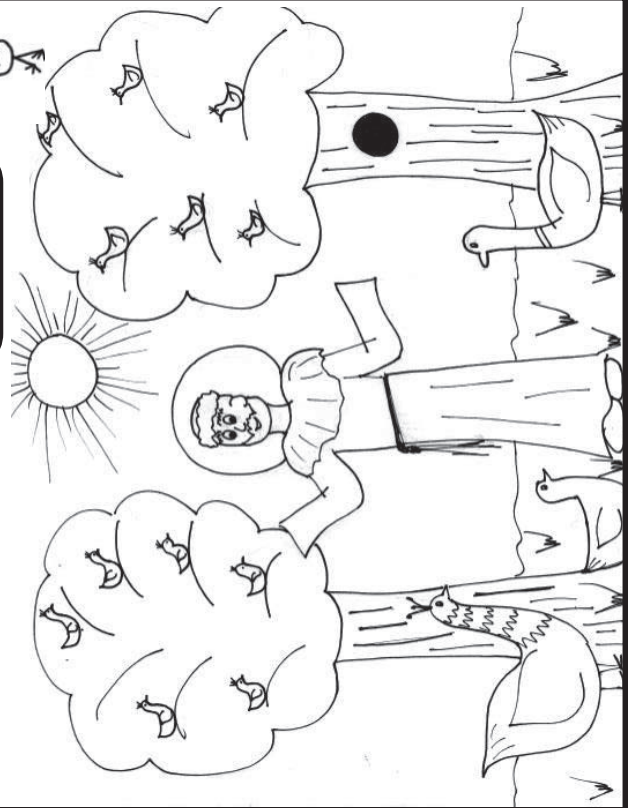
Saint Francis of Assisi

FAME AND FORTUNE

Reflection on Mark 10:35-45

James and John are certainly ambitious, and they were probably simply the first to make this request for places of honor in the kingdom, which is indicated by the fact that the other 10 were so indignant with their ask. All 12 disciples were no doubt operating out of the commonly held expectation that the coming Messiah's power would be political, and that power would be exerted to restore Israel to its former greatness, a greatness enjoyed with the reigns of the Kings David and Solomon, with the 12 tribes exercising an unchallenged authority.

How do we stand before Jesus, who came among us as a servant willing to suffer and die for us? Given the ambitions for power and prestige, for fame and fortune, that we carry, how do we hear these words of Jesus: "It cannot be like that with you"? Do we exercise authority and power in service of others? What are our aspirations for recognition? Do we want to be known for great abilities, or for greatness of love for others poured out selflessly?

SAINT JOHN OF CAPISTRANO

Saint of the Day: October 23

Patron Saint of: Judges

It has been said the Christian saints are the world's greatest optimists. Not blind to the existence and consequences of evil, they base their confidence on the power of Christ's redemption. The power of conversion through Christ extends not only to sinful people but also to calamitous events.

John Capistrano was born in 1386. His education was thorough. His talents and success were great. When he was 26 he was made governor of Perugia. Imprisoned after a battle against the Malatestas, he resolved to change his way of life completely. At the age of 30, he entered the Franciscan novitiate and was ordained a priest four years later.

John's preaching attracted great throngs at a time of religious apathy and confusion. He and 12 Franciscan brethren were received in the countries of central Europe as angels of God. They were instrumental in reviving a dying faith and devotion.

The Franciscan Order itself was in turmoil over the interpretation and observance of the Rule of St. Francis. Through John's tireless efforts and his expertise in law, the heretical Fraticelli were suppressed and the "Spirituals" were freed from interference in their stricter observance. John of Capistrano helped bring about a brief reunion with the Greek and Armenian Churches.

When the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453, John was commissioned to preach a crusade for the defense of Europe. Gaining little response in Bavaria and Austria, he decided to concentrate his efforts in Hungary. He led the army to Belgrade. Under the great General John Hunyadi, they gained an overwhelming victory, and the siege of Belgrade was lifted. Worn out by his superhuman efforts, Capistrano was an easy prey to an infection after the battle. He died on October 23, 1456.
